They provide grants that pay for children’s activities. Within days of receiving applications from eligible families, the staff at our Military Kids office will send special “Top Secret” packages to children, thanking them for their service to our country. Criteria includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The National Guard/Reserve service member must be deployed overseas (OCONUS);</li> <li>● The deployment must be at least 180 days (or 120 days for Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve);</li> <li>● There must be at least 60 days remaining on the orders at the time of application (or 30 days for the Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve);</li> <li>● The child must be at least 5 years old, but not older than a senior in high school (children become ineligible once they have graduated high school);</li> <li>● The child must be a dependent of the service member.</li> </ul>
